Suncoast Parkway (SR 589) Converts to All-Electronic Tolling

Cash will no longer be accepted as of Friday, January 31, 2020

Ocoee, Fla. – Florida's Turnpike will complete implementation of All-Electronic Tolling (AET) on the Suncoast Parkway (SR 589) on Friday, January 31, 2020.

The conversion from SR 52 to U.S. Route 98 completes the AET project and affects the following toll plazas:

- Spring Hill Toll Plaza (Milepost 31)
- CR 578 (Exit 37)
- SR 50/Cortez Boulevard (Exit 46)
- Oak Hammock Toll Plaza (Milepost 53)

This means cash will no longer be accepted along the entire Suncoast Parkway. Tolls will be collected electronically using a SunPass transponder, or other interoperable transponder, and through TOLL-BY-PLATE.

AET allows traffic to continue moving and prevents drivers from jockeying for certain lanes. It also helps drivers to stay focused instead of searching for coins and cash to pay tolls.

For those who are not SunPass customers, the SunPass Mini transponder costs \$4.99 and is available at thousands of retail locations including Publix Super Markets, CVS Pharmacy, Walgreens, Amscot, all AAA locations, Florida Welcome Centers, and all Turnpike service plaza gift shops and convenience stores.
